School Hours

A reminder that school opens at 8.30am and closes at 3.45pm each day, unless prior arrangements have been made with a staff member.

Teacher Only Day

West Otago Athletics

The West Otago Athletics is to be held at the BMC Sports Ground on Tuesday 27 February (W5) this year. Tapanui School is organising the event and there will be more information as soon as it is available. The Eastern Zone Athletics are to be held in Gore on Tuesday 13 March (W7) this year.

CRE Starts

Christian Religious Education sessions will start again on Tuesday afternoons, from 1.30pm until 2.00pm, on 6 March – W6. If you would like your child to be excluded from these sessions please contact the school.

Otago Anniversary and Easter holidays

The school term runs for 11 weeks this term and Easter falls during the term. We do not get any choices from the Ministry of Education and there is no flexibility about whether we take these days or not. It means that we will have two, three day weeks close to the end of the term. Please check the calendar of events above for these dates.

Boiler

The boiler is still out of action. Investigations are underway into the whole system and the Ministry of Education are looking at either fixing or replacing the boiler. When a decision has been reached then I will share this with you.

Swimming Pool

The swimming pool will remain open as per usual. Please remember that it is not being heated by the boiler and relies solely on the sun to generate its warmth. Children are expected to bring their togs and towel in a named bag every day for swimming instruction.

Early Bus

A number of students take advantage of Mr Alexander's bus (the 'early bus') travelling from Heriot to Tapanui at approximately 2.50pm every day. Children are released from class at 2.45pm and they wait outside the school office on the field. When the bus pulls up at the gate they walk sensibly down to the waiting bus, out of the small gate to board. Riding on this bus (as with any school bus) is a privilege and not a right. So we expect that students waiting for the bus and travelling on the bus demonstrate respect and make sensible behaviour choices. Any consistent behaviour contrary to these expectations will result in a loss of privilege to travel on this bus.

Buses and After School Activities

A couple of important notes about after-school activities and Bus Lists:

Please remember to 'sign' your children off the relevant Bus List each time you pick them up after school (or when they won't be travelling on their usual bus). It can be quite time consuming and worrying at times having to search for children who have been collected by parents etc and we haven't been notified. The Bus Lists sit on the counter just inside the office door, unless a staff member has them outside lining children up ready for their buses.



- If we don't receive any form of notification from parents/caregivers before the buses leave each day, all children will be sent home on the bus as per usual.
- Remember to let us know of any changes at the start of each term as <u>Bus Lists always stay the same from term to term unless you let us know otherwise!</u>
- If your child/ren attend regular after-school activities each week, we can put a permanent note on the bus list so as to make it easier for both staff to 'find' children after school when doing bus duty and also to save you time as you don't have to 'sign' your child out on the bus list each time.

If you would like to have this done, please fill out the form (on the next page) and return to the office. Just remember that if circumstances change, e.g. your child/ren stop going to this activity after school for whatever reason, you need to let Pauline know so the bus list can be changed again.


